	13 years have passed since the Syrian Civil War started. When the Syrian citizens who were tired of the dictatorship initiated non-violent protests in March 2011, no one thought the ensuing chaos would last beyond nine years. However, a civil war broke out when the Syrian government responded with weapons against the protests.

Before the war, Syria was a beautiful and prosperous country with more annual international tourists than Australia. However, during the 13years of civil war, hundreds of thousands of people were killed and 6.7 million people were displaced. Syria's situation became one of the most serious humanitarian problems in the world

The end to this tragedy does not seem to be in sight. As of 2019, 13 million Syrians (over 70% of Syria's total population) have been unable to return to their homes due to indiscriminate bombings that have continued until recently. Half of these people are children like Naamat Hamawi, and 93% of them suffer from extreme poverty in harsh and defective urban environments not equipped to protect refugees. Furthermore, more than 30% of Syrian children are unable to attend school and suffer from poverty, child marriage and child labor.

Like Naamat Hamawi who has hope despite her difficult circumstances, the Syrian refugees are also people who have their own futures that they cherish. The Syrian Civil War, which has been threatening the lives of more than 10 million Syrians for more than nine years, is one of the greatest tragedies of our generation. It is a situation that we should all take responsibility in addressing.
